Essay Unit 1: *Process* 3

Strategies: Decide the purpose of your essay and think of some general ideas; explain why your ideas are important; make your thesis statement sound more advanced; write a dramatic introduction; make your ideas clearer by adding examples; write a clear introduction to your paragraph with a topic sentence; make your steps clearer by describing an experience; get a reaction from a classmate; improve your style by using more advanced vocabulary, combining sentences and changing beginnings of sentences

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Strategies: Write advanced rather than simple ideas for a Cause and Effect Essay; consider several topics for your essay; add details to make your ideas clearer and more interesting; write an advanced-style thesis statement; make your ideas clearer with summary statements; make your style more advanced by avoiding overgeneralization; write an interesting introduction: seven types; write an interesting conclusion; make your ideas clearer with hypothetical situations; apply the strategies and improve your style; listen to a partner read your essay to you.

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Strategies: Use a variety of ways to support your opinion; give the other side's opinion and then explain why it is not a good argument; write an outline to organize your ideas; interview to get more support for your argument and the other side's argument; write a clear argumentation thesis statement; use an academic style; get a reaction from a classmate.

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Strategies: Strategies: Use the sandwich technique; introduce a quote and explain it deeply; use academic expressions to introduce a quote; use academic expressions to introduce an explanation of a quote; write the first paragraph of the body first; get a reaction from a peer; use a different mode in each paragraph of the body of the essay; Listen to your partner read your essay to you.

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
